Route Marshals

The official MoonWalk hype squad lifting Walkers spirits, cheering all the way! Situated in a designated Zone, Route Marshals help Walker's progress safely and in the right direction, answering queries, request assistance and work with the Police and Security to manage busy junctions. A lively and fun role, one we know Walkers appreciate to get them through the night!

Cyclists

A crucial MoonWalk resource helping Route Marshals in busy areas providing a rapid response to any non-medical issues. Designated Front and Backmarker teams (for Full and Half Moon challenges) are the eyes and ears out on the route, notifying the Call Centre of where Walkers are at all times. This role is not for the faint-hearted! 30+ miles will easily be covered throughout the night. Volunteers need to supply their own bike and safety equipment.

Drivers

Love driving or have experience of driving through the busy streets of London? Then look no further, this role is for you! Working in pairs, the driving teams transfer Route Marshals to and from their Zones and return retired Walkers to MoonWalk Arena. Following the MoonWalk route, drivers smile and wave to every Walker they see, must be aged 25 and hold a full, clean driving licence.

Coach Marshals

Responsible for ensuring that Volunteers are not only dropped off and collected on time and at the correct location, Coach Marshals keep Volunteers buzzing and raring to go when on board our coaches.

Call Centre

The Call Centre is the beating heart of the MoonWalk, reacting and responding to any queries that are raised throughout the event. Located off-site, the Call Centre answers the Volunteer Hotline as well as calls round to the rest of the Volunteer family throughout the night to find out how they are getting on.

Baggage

Thousands of bags are quite a sight to behold and take some serious organising! Volunteers register, secure and return baggage to Walkers at the end of their challenge.

Meet & Greet

The first faces Walkers and Volunteers see as they approach Clapham Common. Big smiles and waves are a must from the Meet & Greet Team, welcoming and guiding eager Walkers across Clapham Common into MoonWalk Arena.

Directional

Experience the incredible buzz and atmosphere of thousands of Walkers arriving at Clapham Common. Friendly and welcoming faces support Walkers as they navigate their way around MoonWalk Arena, getting into the MoonWalk spirit!

Entrance Gate/Start Line

As the nerves and excitement builds, the priority for the Entrance Gate/Start Line team is ensure everyone enters the MoonWalk safely and efficiently. Working with Security, helping Walkers as they arrive, managing queues and handing out start wave wristbands ahead of 'show time'... clapping and cheering Walkers as they head off out onto their challenge.

Finish Line

Once Walkers are on their way, the Start Line magically turns into the Finish Line. Welcoming back tired but euphoric Walkers, handing out medals and congratulating them on completing their challenge is incredibly moving and rewarding.

Service Stations

Walking a marathon is hungry and thirsty work and with multiple Service Stations along the route, Volunteers cheer on Walkers, hand out water or fruit snacks, manage queues, keep the area clear of rubbish and keep everyone moving.

Clean & Recycling

Located in MoonWalk Arena, this is a great (and vital!) role if you need to have a sit down every so often. A very sociable position, chatting with Walkers, collecting litter and recycling, keeping the MoonWalk site tidy for all.

Pop-Up Shop

Our infamous Pop-Up Shop is a very popular part of the MoonWalk. From selling bra pins, hoodies and hats to water bottles... the Pop-Up Shop offers a variety Walk the Walk items to purchase and some can be obtained for a donation. With thousands of Walkers keen to buy merchandise, this is a fun and super busy area as our merch flies off the shelves!

Volunteer Tent

With more than 600 Volunteers passing through the Volunteer Tent over the course of The MoonWalk, Volunteers help to prepare everyone for the night ahead. With several different roles available, this is the perfect job for anyone who may need access to toilet facilities or a sit down.
